

Dear partners,

Oswald Chamber's *My Utmost for His Highest* has several applicable devotions. One in particular stands out as being right on point. Let me quote part of the September 5th lesson based on Matthew 26:40:

"Watch with Me." -with no private point of view of your own at all, but watch entirely with me. In the early stages we do not watch with Jesus, we watch for Him. We do not watch with Him through the revelation of the Bible; in the circumstances of our lives. Our Lord is trying to introduce us to identification with Himself in a particular Gethsemane, and we will not go; we say- "No, Lord, I cannot see the meaning of this, it is bitter." How can we possibly watch with Someone Who is inscrutable? How are we going to understand Jesus sufficiently to watch Him in His Gethsemane, when we do not know even what He is suffering for? We do not know how to watch with Him; we are only used to the idea of Jesus watching with us.

In our work here at the Ranch, we can easily get caught up in the needs of the boys and their families at the expense of our devotion to Jesus Christ. We could start to believe that we are in charge of a boy changing. Or we might think if we were just better counselors, a mom or dad would finally get the point of the training we are giving them. We might begin to depend on the program for real change instead of depending on God. In short, we could become more devoted to the program and the boys than we are to Christ. Our own perspective could come to rule what we do here. ***We might ask the Lord to come and watch with us, instead of us watching with Him.***

Jesus will suffer no competitors for our affection. His perspective is based on His own attributes. He is the way, the truth, and the life. Is my affection turned to anything besides Him? Do I see the boys as a cause unto themselves? Or do I see a boy and his family as Jesus sees them?

If we are watching with Him, we start to see the boys in a different light. We see that God is always at work around us, (John 5:17) and that we are invited to join God in His work. When a boy doesn't want to do his work in school, God is at work; is disrespectful, God is at work; or shows contempt for his peers or authorities, God is at work. He may be challenging the boy's laziness, self-centeredness, or contempt for himself. If we are watching with Jesus, we begin

to want to work with Jesus, instead of asking for His blessing on our own work. We start to watch with Jesus. Please pray for us that we would *a/ways* be watching *with* Jesus.
